On December 7, 2020, VVWRA solicited bids through a request for proposal for the construction of a reclaim water bypass line at the Apple Valley Sub Regional Reclamation Facility at 21060 Otoe Road Apple Valley, CA 92307.

The Contractor will furnish all labor, equipment, materials, and supervision to perform the following tasks:

- Supply all required material, parts, and pieces per design
- Excavate and connect to the existing reclaim water line
- Trench and construct new 6" bypass line
- Connect bypass line to existing collection system piping
- Backfill, pack, repave the site

## **Executive Summary of Financial Statements**

1. Cash balance at December 31, 2020 is \$17.58 million with reserves required for operations. The agreements with State Water Resources Control Board require we maintain the loan principal and interest payment amount for the following year.

- 2. The December 2020 financial statements show a surplus of \$2,119,240 (a cumulative year-to-date surplus of \$1,321,276) to reflect \$1.02 million (cumulative \$6.10 million) depreciation expense. The depreciation expense is a part of financial statements but does not affect our cash flow.
- 3. The current month user fee revenue is higher than a budgeted average monthly amount by \$68,742. However, the connection fee revenue received during the current month is much lower than a budgeted average monthly amount by \$180,687. In fact, the year-to-date connection fee revenue is only \$469,575 that is 40.143% of the budget of \$1,169,750 for the period from July 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020. The expenses are what the staff processed during the month that may not match corresponding revenues. The staff will record matching expenses at a year-end by accruing incurred costs.




